Kids & Teens Resource Centre (K&TRC) is a registered non-governmental organisation established in December 2002 to advance, promote, and support efforts of government and all other stakeholders involved in children and young people developmental activities. K&TRC have made remarkable impact in the lives of young people in communities through service provision, information sharing, capacity development, mentoring and participatory community development.

2.1 STAFF RETREAT

K&TRC started the year off with a 2-day dynamic Staff retreat. The retreat kicked-off on the 13th of February 2020 with different sessions aimed at getting the staff both mentally and physically prepared for the year. Different speakers were invited and feedbacks were gotten from the staff to enable the management know how best to yield maximum productivity. It was such an emotional one as opinions were shared, questions answered and expectations clarified. The sessions ranged from topic discussions to feedbacks, lunch break and exercises/games. The topics discussed include:

2.2 PRODUCTION OF BIOGAS AND COMPOST FROM ORGANIC WASTES

One major challenge facing Africa is Environmental Pollution. **Environment** is one of the thematic areas of K&TRC. This prompted the collaboration with Centre for International Migration and Development (CIM), to promote the environment by converting organic waste to gas and compost.



The project aims at empowering young people in schools by training them to convert waste to wealth. To achieve this, teachers from 10 different schools which include (Acquinas College, Heirs College, Methodist High School, Oyemekun Grammer School, Owo High School, Icon College, St. Peters Unity School, St. Louis Girls Grammer School and Fiwasaye Girls Grammer School) received comprehensive training to be able to pass the knowledge across to the students.



The project kicked off with the launching which took place at Royal Birds Hotel on the 20th of February 2020. Mr Moses who came in from Germany took the teachers through an interesting learning process with team building exercises. The training lasted for 2 weeks in which the teachers successfully built the biogas digester and compost tumbler.

2.3 KNOWING SERIES (KS)



Young people have the right to the information and skills they need to protect their health and this is what Knowing Series provides both in-school and out of school Adolescent & Young People (AYP). Knowing Series is an adolescent centred program that builds the capacities of young people with life skills to enable them to make healthy and informed decisions that will have great impact on the fulfilment of their full potentials. During the first quarter, KS was held at FUTA Secondary School and Covenant Academy, Ado Ekiti reaching out to about 500 AYPs.

2.4 PROJECT SDGfy



The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a collection of 17 global goals adopted by all United Nations Member States in 2015, designed as a blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. It is important for young people to be conversant with the SDGs as they play a vital and active role in actualizing these goals.

K&TRC started the project SDGfy as proposed by a serving corp member, Austin Omogiate, to educate adolescents and young people how they can actively contribute to the sustainable development of their communities. The project was launched at Just Model School both at the Junior and Secondary level comprising of about 250 students.

2.5 CHASE CLUB



The CHASE club is a weekly activity carried out at Best Solution Nursery and Primary School, FUTA and Mega School, Ijapo. Pupils in primary class 4, 5 & 6 are equipped with knowledge ranging from sanitation and hygiene to environment and well-being and also skills like soap making.

2.6 HIV TESTING SERVICES



Kids & Teens Resource Centre serves as a youth friendly centre that not only provides free HIV services but also partner with several organizations to ender the services during programs or outreaches. The services rendered are performed by trained personnel in an environment that provides privacy with the end goal to make AYP comfortable. Personnel render professional, unbiased and non-judgement services with counselling as well as distribution of free contraceptives. In the first quarter, over 300 free HIV testing were carried out for AYPs.

2.7 VULNERABLE CHILDREN (VC) PROGRAM



The VC program is one to change the lives of children under the age of 18 who lacks basic amenities and resources required for them to attain education, health services among others. For sustainability, parents, most especially mothers are empowered either to capital to start a business and or/skills acquisition.

In the first quarter of 2020, K&TRC supported the educational and welfare needs of Ojo Oluwanifemi, Ojo Oluwaseun, Olatunji Taiwo, Olatunji Kehinde, Olatunde Jumoke, Olatunde Marvellous, Olatunde Deborah, Oladele Adekunle and Titilayo Juliet.

2.8 GVG PROGRAM



The GVG program is a group of widows coming together to solicit funds from CBN with the aid of Community and Social Development Agency. With the help of Gladys; a staff of K&TRC who is in charge of the program, they were able to procure the funds to build a

skills acquisition centre last year. In the first quarter, the receipts of payment used for purchase of materials were collated and also frequent inspection and monitoring of the building progress.

2.9 GUEST OF THE MONTH

Guest of the Month is one of the major activities carried out by K&TRC to familiarize stakeholders, professionals, consultants, academicians etc. about the activities of the organization with the aim of initiating partnerships, collaborations and resource mobilization. In year 2020, the organization set a goal of inviting at least two guests monthly then assigned two staff for each of the months. 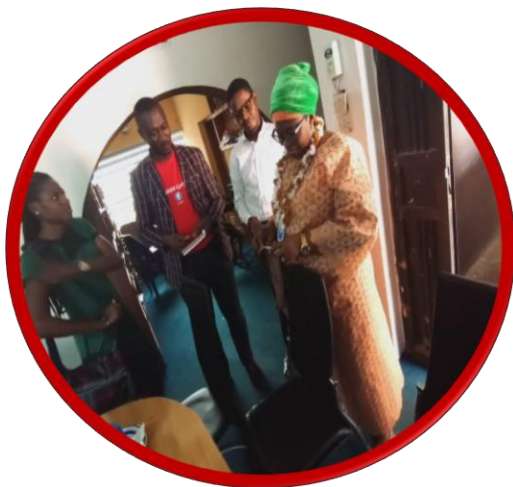
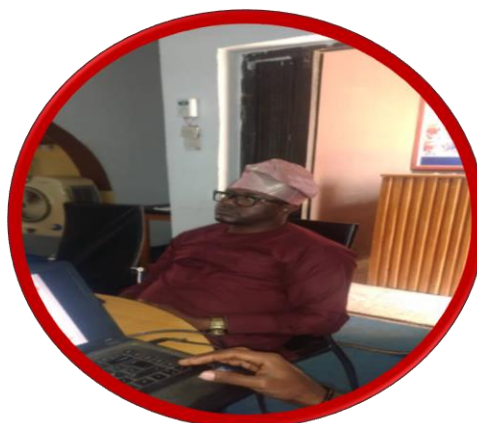

3.1 World Cancer Day



World Cancer Day is celebrated every year on the 4th of February. Year 2020 edition was commemorated in Akure, Ondo State by sister NGOs. The CEO in person of Martin-Mary Falana, The Executive Director in Person of Trinity, as well as the MEAL Manager Dammy and other staff of K&TRC Tiwalade, Kemi and Gladys represented the

organization at the event. Awareness walk was organized to celebrate this edition and health screening was carried out after the awareness walk at Nigeria Union of Journalist Hall, Akure, Ondo State. The theme for the year is “I AM AND I WILL”

3.2 International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation

This day was commemorated on the 6th of February at Federal University of Technology, Akure, Ondo State. K&TRC staff; Nifemi, Eunice, Gladys, Sanmi and Tiwalade engaged in a social campaign to sensitize as well as engage youths to speak up against FGM. Thereafter, some of the students were interviewed and grouped photograph were taken with FGM placards.



The idea to engage youths was prompted by the theme of the year which is “UNLEASHING YOUTH POWER”

3.3 International Condom Day



This day was commemorated at Araromi Brothel in Akure. Sanmi and Nifemi accompanied the CEO; Martin-Mary Falana where he performed condom demonstration as well as distributed contraceptives to the sex workers. They were also informed on the importance of contraceptives use to combat the spread of HIV, STIs and unwanted pregnancy among others.

This day is observed to promote safer sex awareness.

This year's edition was celebrated through Social Media campaign. Becky who was in charge worked with Nifemi to come up with Infographics and contents about Social Justice which were posted on K&TRC social media platforms. Students were also encouraged to value their mother language.

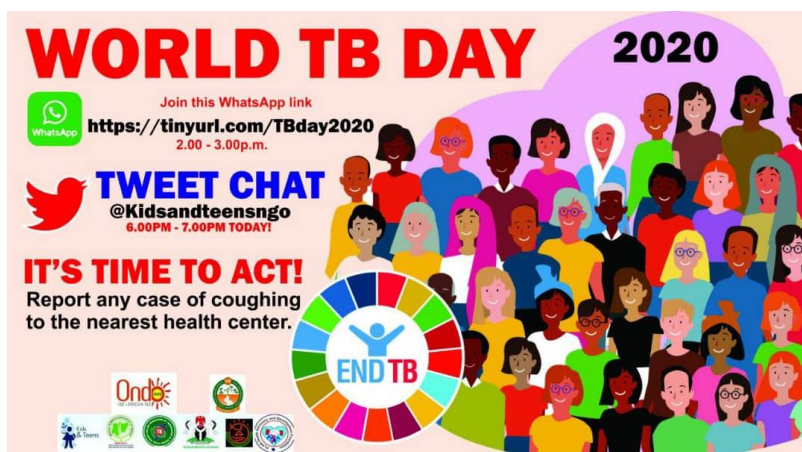


3.6 World Kidney Day Organised by Kidney Control Alliance

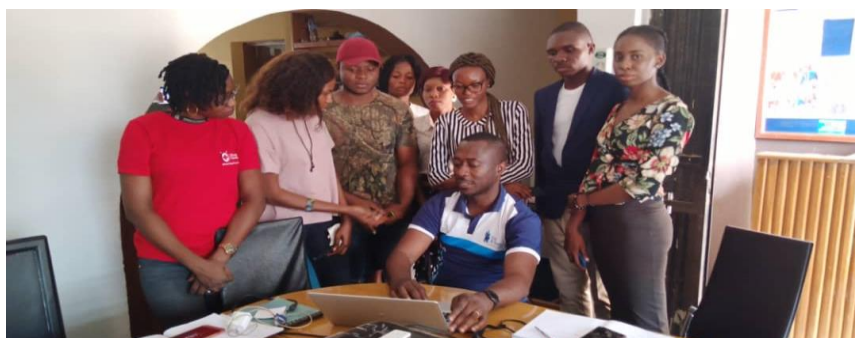


K&TRC partnered with other sister NGOs to commemorate WKD with free health screening, public lecture and awareness campaign in Akure, Ondo State.
